# PROGRAMS FOR YOUTH

As part of our investment in our community, Boone Power offers several programs throughout the year to educate students about the electric cooperative industry and to support their creativity and community spirit.

## ALL GRADES

### Wired to Create Student Art Contest

Students in **grades K-12** are encouraged to enter artwork that highlights what keeps Indiana moving forward -- the people, places, industries, and communities that power our state! Winners will receive cash prizes and have their artwork celebrated across the state.

### 4-H Electric Workshops

Boone Power hosts workshops each year to help **4-H Electric participants** learn fundamentals of electricity in order to complete their projects.

### Safety Demonstrations

Boone Power provides demonstrations on electrical safety for **classes or other student groups** upon request. Classes also are invited to come to the co-op for a tour and to learn about electricity, safety, and co-op careers.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL

### Youth Power and Hope Awards\*

This program honors **fifth-eighth graders** for their volunteerism and acts of kindness in the community.

### Camp Kilowatt\*

**Incoming seventh graders** enjoy traditional summer camp activities at Camp Tecumseh such as canoeing and horseback riding, while learning about electrical safety, energy, and careers at electric co-ops.

## ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

### Think! Energy Program

Through our partnership with the National Energy Foundation, local **fourth grade** teachers can enroll in our Think! Energy program to help their students learn about electricity generation and energy efficiency.

## HIGH SCHOOL & BEYOND

### Indiana Electric Cooperative Page Day

**High school students** learn about daily activities that take place at the Indiana Statehouse during the legislative session and take part in a mock bill activity.

### Indiana Youth Tour to Washington, D.C.\*

This week-long trip in June for **incoming high school seniors** includes visits to Gettysburg, Arlington National Cemetery, Smithsonian museums, a night cruise on the Potomac River, meeting legislators, and learning about cooperatives.

### Annual Scholarship Drawing\*

Boone Power awards scholarships to students who are dependents or legal wards of Boone Power members and enrolled full-time in a **post-secondary institution** through a random drawing at its annual business meeting each spring.
